No. 1. represents part of a Survey made for George Green on Warrant dated the 26<sup>th</sup> day of February 1794. This Survey interferes Fifty Eight acres and Ninety perches with the Anthony Snyder Survey. George Green conveyed to James and John Sample the present owners.

No. 2. represents part of a Survey made for Robert Warren on Warrant dated the 25<sup>th</sup> day of March 1793. this Survey interferes One hundred and fifty Six acres and Seventy Six perches with the Anthony Snyder Survey. Robert Warren conveyed to George Green. who conveyed to William Couch who devised the Same to Edward Couch the present owner.
