



Daniel McManamy was Elizabeth Harrison Hall's Claim and was patented on a warrant dated 10<sup>th</sup> of June 1772. Samuel Moorhead's land was on a warrant of December 22<sup>d</sup> 1772. James Moore's land was returned on a Warrant of April 18<sup>th</sup> 1774. Michael Huffnagle's draft could not be procured but was patented on a warrant dated 16<sup>th</sup> of August 1784 and patent dated 24<sup>th</sup> of December 1785. John and William Moore's is also Warranted and patented.
