



The above appears to have been Surveyed to Levi Hollingsworth on the 30th of October 1775. By War^t of the 6 of August 1773. Upon examining for the land called for by Samuel Pattersons Location. I found that the land Contained in the above Survey was the only place that appeared to suit the discription of the Location. it being the only place where the waters of Susquehanna rise to the South of the path on the dividing ridge. I therefore Surveyed the land pursuing lines which I found marked upon the ground. which appear to be the lines of Levi Hollingsworth and have made return of the Same on the Location of Samuel Patterson which is here with enclosed. Situate in Green Township Indiana County. (Unseated) owner not known. No one claiming under Pattersons titles that I could find.
