



Situate in Buffalo township (Union (late Berks) County) Surveyed the 5th day of November 1832 by virtue of an Order granted to Jacob Gemberling dated the 3^d day of April 1769. N^o 954. Containing three hundred & three Acres with the Usual Allowance &c.

Note The same tract of land ~~was~~ being part of a tract of 629 1/2 Acres Surveyed the 25th day of February 1769 for Captⁿ John Brady being the Allotment which fell to him on the Division of a tract of 8000 Acres Surveyed for the Officers of Col. Turbut Francis' Corps in pursuance of an Order of Survey N^o 1. And now owned & occupied by Abbot Green in right of the said John Brady. — Patented.
