



Situate on the south branch of Little Juniatta in Antis township Huntingdon County, containing two hundred and fifty seven acres and one fourth acres and allowance of six per cent for roads. Surveyed for John James on order No 4926 dated the 13th day of April 1768.

No 1 represents part of a survey made for Joshua Burley on warrant dated the 21st day of May 1793, this survey interferes six acres and sixty perches with the John James tract. Joshua Burley conveyed to James E. Stenart the present owner.

No 2 represents part of a survey made for Thomas Robins on warrant dated the 1st day of February 1794. This survey interferes fifty four and one half acres with the John James tract. Thomas Robins conveyed to Abraham Dubois who conveyed to Blaringer & Co. the present owners.

No 3 represents part of a survey made for Joseph Shippen on order No 1 dated the 1st day of August 1766. This tract interferes one hundred and ninety six acres and seventy perches with the John James survey. Joseph Shippen conveyed or devised the same to Henry Shippen who conveyed to Josiah Blosser & Alexander McFarland the present owners.
