



Draft of a tract of land situate in Washington township (formerly Antrim township) Franklin County containing thirty two acres forty six perches & allowance of six per cent for roads &c. Surveyed the 17th of March 1830 (on an application granted David Stoner for 50⁹⁵ of land on Antetern — joining John & Jacob Bances land in Antrim township dated the 15th of January 1768 No. 4700) in pursuance of a contract with the Board of property for carrying into effect the several Acts of Assembly relating to proprietary rights &c.

The land above described is the same as a survey containing 32⁹⁵ 32 per & all which was surveyed on a warrant granted David Stoner dated the 2nd of September 1786 there is no evidence of any survey having been made on the app^{ly} of David Stoner but the land being held by Stoner previous to the date of the warr^t it is presumed that the above application was intended to be laid on it.
