No 1 represents a survey made for James Dunlap on warrant dated the 27th January 1793. This survey interferes fourteen acres and one hundred and ten perches with the George Cunningham survey. James Dunlap conveyed to John Cannon who conveyed to Benj-in R. Morgan the present owner.

No 2 represents part of a survey made for James Dunlap on warrant dated the 15th January 1794, this survey interferes forty one acres and ninety five perches with the George Cunningham tract. James Dunlap who conveyed to John Cannon who conveyed to Benj-in R. Morgan the present owner.

No 3 represents part of a survey made for John Cannon on an improvement made 30 years ago. This survey interferes thirty five acres and one hundred and fifty perches with the George Cunningham tract. John Cannon conveyed to Benj-in R. Morgan the present owner.
