Draft of a tract of land situate in Antrim township Franklin County containing forty five acres twenty seven perches & allowance of six per cent for roads &c located the 13th day of March 1830 (on a warrant granted Robert McCullough for 100^{acs} of land between land he bought of the Rev^d Richard Peters & land of Samuel Findlay which was improved & thought to be in his patent in Antrim township dated the 11th of Sep^r 1772) in pursuance of a contract with the Board of property for the purpose of carrying into effect the several Acts of Assembly relating to proprietary rights &c.
