Surveyd 21 May 1829 on warrant granted to William Chambers, for 50 acres "joining William ~~Chambers~~ McConnell and Christopher Irwin in Lurgan township dated 24 of May 1753, and in pursuance of a contract with the Board of Property for carrying into effect the several Acts of Assembly relating to unpatented land under proprietary rights &c &c

Report- The above tract is covered and wholly included in a survey of 119 acres surveyd June 1786, on a warrant granted to John Gray dated the 24 February 1786 & confirmed by patent 15 November 1787. The red lined figure representing the balance of this tract not now covered by the warrant of William Chambers, probably the whole tract was originally held by the warrant to Chambers; but no evidence appears of a survey on said warrant. Therefore the warrant is laid according to the street location of the same. Wm S. Davis Owned and occupied by Joseph Wall, under the patent founded on Grays warrant
