



The above described tract of ninety four acres and sixty eight perches & allowance of six per cent for roads &c. was surveyed was surveyed the 7th day of May 1822 by William S. Davis then Deputy Surveyor as appears from a draft now in the Deputy Surveyors office. It being part of a larger tract of 202^{9/8} 151 perches & all. situate in Fannet-township (formerly Cumberland now) Franklin County which was surveyed in pursuance of a warrant granted to John Elder for 250^{9/8} bearing date the 16th day of April 1763. Examined the above survey and found it to be correct.
