



Draft of a tract of land situate now in Washington township Franklin County, containing one hundred and thirty four acres one hundred & fifteen perches & allowance of six per cent for roads &c which was surveyed the 28<sup>th</sup> day of September 1789 by Matthew Henderson, Esq<sup>t</sup> then Deputy Surveyor in pursuance of a warrant granted George Martin for 100 a<sup>s</sup> dated the 6<sup>th</sup> day of Sept<sup>r</sup> 1762 a rough draft of which remains on file in the Deputy Surveyors office of Franklin County, Certified the 21<sup>st</sup> day of January 1830. In pursuance of a contract with the Board of property for carrying into effect the several Acts of Assembly relating to proprietary rights &c.
