



Draught of a tract of land situate in Guilford township Franklin County (formerly Cumberland) containing two hundred & seventy nine acres one hundred & forty six perches and allowance of six per cent for roads &c. Surveyed 22 obly 1829, by virtue of a warrant granted to John Gibson for 300 A^c. "On the wagon road leading to Potomack joining" John Forsythe and Charles Magill including the head of the Spring & a small improvement began by Robert Meek in Guilford township" bearing date the 29th June 1750. And in pursuance of a contract with the Board of Property for carrying into effect the several Acts of Assembly relating to unpatented lands under proprietary rights &c &c

Report.

The above described tract of land is ascertained to lie within the lines and is wholly included in a tract of 443 1/2 acres surveyed 12 May 1768 on warrant to Robert Cummins dated 16 December 1766 and patented to William Kirby 26 May 1773 as recited in Deeds
