



A draft of a tract of land situate on the waters of Dunning's creek in St Clair township Bedford County containing five hundred and forty four acres and one hundred and sixty seven perches and allowance of six per cent for roads & so surveyed for John Boul on warrant dated the 1st day of June 1763. - No 1 represented in part by dotted lines shows part of the lines of a tract of land surveyed for Ephriam Williams on warrant dated the 22nd day of August 1785. This tract interferes eleven acres and five perches with the John Boul survey. Ephriam Williams conveyed to Thomas Vickroy from whom the same was sold by the sheriff of Bedford county to Frederick Dupps, the present owner. - No 2 represented by the green lines is part of a draft of a tract of land surveyed for George Imler on warrant dated the 12th day of June 1794, this tract interferes fifty nine acres and fifty perches with the John Boul survey. George Imler's executors conveyed to Thomas Crayle the present owner. N.B. - Leonard Berkhimer claims two hundred acres of the John Boul tract by virtue of a settlement commenced twenty five years ago upon which no survey has been made. N.B. - Abraham Burkhart claims part of said tract by virtue of a settlement commenced ten years ago upon which no survey has been made. James O'Connor, D.S.
