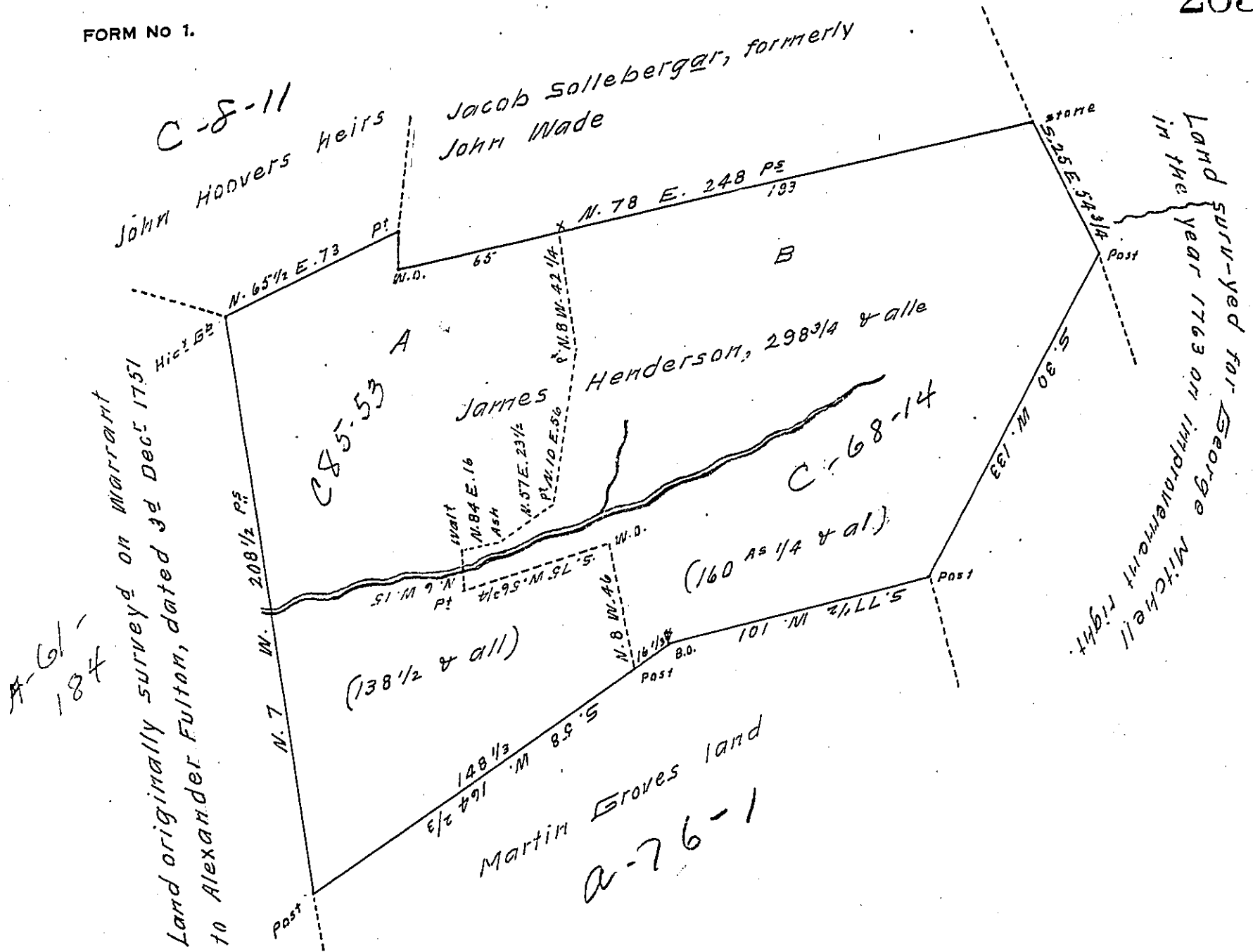

Draught of a tract of land situate in Green township Franklin County containing in all two hundred & ninety eight acres & three quarters & allowance of six per cent for roads & located in pursuance of a contract with the Board of Property for ascertaining surveying and returning unpatented lands under proprietary rights & and by virtue of a warrant dated 10th June 1762 granted to James Henderson for 100^{ac} joining Alexander Fulton, and George Mitchell, in Letterkenry township ascertained on premises and calculated from recent surveys in the office September 1828.

The above tract is covered by the following office rights to wit:
The part marked A. seperated by ~~a~~ dotted lines & containing 138 1/2 acres has been patented on a warrant to John Henderson dated 21 February 1789 & owned & occupied by Henry Stouffer and Jacob Solleberger under said title - And the part B. has been surveyed & returned & perhaps patented; on an order of survey to Mary Henderson in trust for herself and children by her late husband James Henderson dated 23d August 1766. No ~~the~~ alias 940, owned by the heirs of John Grave, decd under said title - Note - Although the above survey greatly exceeds the warrant yet the relative boundaries in the warrant naturally locates all the land, which was notorious as that of James Henderson, recognized by adjoiners.
