



Draught of a tract of land situate in the Horse Valley Letterkenny township Franklin County, containing fifty acres one quarter and allowance of six per cent for roads &c surveyed 24<sup>th</sup> September 1829, in pursuance of a contract with the Board of Property for carrying into effect the several Acts of Assembly relating to unpatented lands under Proprietary rights &c and by virtue of an order of survey dated 26 June 1767 No 4045 granted to James McAlister for 50 acres in the Horse Valley above Pine Run & below Sissneys Bar near his other land.

Report.

The above tract is wholly covered by a survey of 277<sup>a</sup> 22<sup>rs</sup> & al made on a warrant to Andrew Wilson dated 16 March 1793 - the dotted figures A & B represent the balance of survey on Wilsons warrant. Note. The place marked G seems to have been part of the land intended for the above order; which land is held on an order to James Miller dated 23<sup>d</sup> Jan<sup>y</sup> 1767, find endorsed on Millers draft, "disputed by James McAlister."

Note - Located the above as near the place intended as may be; keeping out of the lines of James Millers survey. John Skinner owner unseated.
