



Draught of a tract of land situate in Green & Southampton townships Franklin County, containing forty five acres one hundred and forty one perches & allowance of six per cent for Roads &c. surveyed 24 November 1828 in pursuance of a contract with the Board of Property for carrying into effect the several Acts of Assembly relating to unpatented lands under Proprietary rights &c. And by virtue of a warrant dated 24 October 1750 granted to John Johnston for 50 acres" joining south of his other land formerly Thomas Edmundston to include the head of his Draft in Hopewell"

 The above tract is wholly the same as a tract surveyed 2nd December 1791 on Warrant to George Johnston dated 4 ~~March~~ ^{May} 1791 & confirmed by patent to said Johnston who admits that the warrant of 1750 was granted to his Father John Johnston for the same land

Owned by George Johnston in part & part by David Nevim John Klire tenant under Nevim- Note- No evidence of survey on the warrant of 1750 or of any person claiming under the same.
