Note The same tract of land was surveyed the — day of February 1769 for Ensign Piper being the allotment which fell to him on the Division of 8000 Acres Surveyed for the officers of Col Francis Turbut Corps in pursuance of an order of Survey No 1 And now Owned & occupied by John Thompson in right of the said Ensign Piper.
