



The whole of the above tract is an interference of a Tract of 160<sup>as</sup> surveyed by Geo. Stevenson D. S. for himself Jan. 29<sup>th</sup> 1760 in pursuance of a Warrt dated December 16<sup>th</sup> 1758, and also an interference of a Tract of 82<sup>as</sup> 149 ps. surveyed on Warrant dated 23<sup>d</sup> feb 173<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> to C. Eckert patented 31<sup>st</sup> May 1822. The above Tract was a long time in dispute between the claimants under Stevenson & the Eckerts. When Doct'r Wampler came in possession of Eckert's property, the dispute was settled betwixt himself and Abraham Reiff claiming under Stevenson, and Wampler remained in possession of the greater part of the above Tract relinquishing along the line A.B. a small strip of land to Reiff
