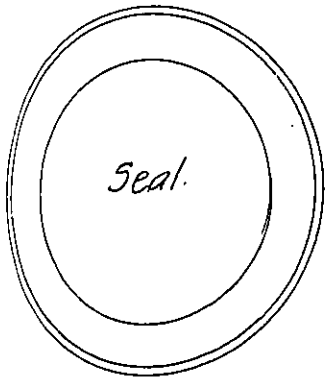

thwait purchasers of one thousand Acres in one of the two tract- of one thous-
and each laid out to Will^m Hudson Tho: Langhorn & Arthur Burdal wth
himself near Brandywine Creek in the County of Chester. These are to re-
quire thee forthwith to resurvey and lay out or cause to be resurvey'd and laid
out to the 5^d Jn^o Cornwell the 5^d Number of Five Hundred Acres out of
one of the Tracts afores^d and make returns thereof into my Secretaries
Office. Given under my Hand and Seal at Philadelphia the 2th day of ye^e
first Moth 170⁹*
