Nor. west by a line of marked trees deviding it from some other war^t of the said Manor Land 92 Perches to a stake set in the ground being a corner deviding it from John Rambo's Land from thenc- by a line of marked trees and ye same land East North

east 700 Perches to a Hickry marked by Scoolkeele- from thence by the sevrall Courses thereof S 25 E 28 Perches S 35 E 44 Perches South 15 East 20 Perches to ye plac- of beginneing Containeing 400 $\frac{3}{4}$ 9 32 P and is according to ye bounds above described. Reurveyd the 10th day of ye 2^d mo. 1702 and return'd into the Generall Survey^rs Offic- at Philadelphia ye 18th day of the same: With the prickt line at the Request of the said Peeter Cok signiefing how farre his 250 acers will extend leaueing the overplus being 150 $\frac{3}{4}$ & odd perches. Next Gunn's Rambo's Land if the Comf's please to allow of it.
