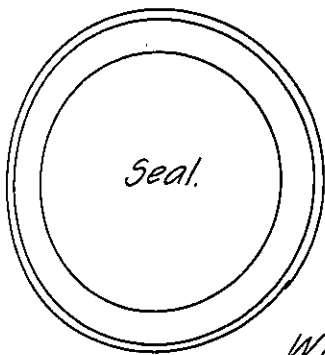


Pensylvania

Whereas Thomas Cooper Settling on presumption about two years agoe on Part of the Propriet^{rs} Mann^r of Rocklands hath requested us to grant him two hundred Acres of Land within the same where he is now settled adjoining on Edw^d Harris and Birmingham Township for which he hath agreed to pay to the Prop^{rs} Use fifty pounds at certain fixed times before & at the 29th of Septemb^r next as also two Years Rent for the time past at one penny Sterl. for every acre P. annum. These are to Authorize thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd to the s^d Thomas the s^d number of two hundred Acres of Land in ye s^d place within the s^d Mann^r and make Returns thereof into the Secret^{ries} office which Survey in case he fulfill the Agree^{mt} afores^d shall be valid Otherwise to be void and of no effect as if the same had never been made. Given under our hands and the Seal of the Province at Philad^{ia} the 22^d of ye 10th Moth 1701
