These are in y<sup>e</sup> Proprietary's Name to will & require thee forthw<sup>th</sup> to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto him y<sup>e</sup> sd. number of Acres in y<sup>e</sup> aforementioned County where not already taken up, after all former Warr<sup>ts</sup> executed he seating & improving y<sup>e</sup> same w<sup>th</sup> in six Months from y<sup>e</sup> date of Survey according to Regulation: & make returns thereof into y<sup>e</sup> Secretary's Office. Given at Philadelphia y<sup>e</sup> 10<sup>th</sup> <sup>12<sup>th</sup></sup>/<sub>mo.</sub> 1684
