Surveyd and Layd out the 4th of December 1716 by a Warrt from the Commissioners dated the 22^d of the 9th month 1715 unto John Cadwallader of the County of Chester two hundred acres of land (with the usual addition of Six P. Cent) in the said County Beginning at a black oak marked at a Corner of Jeremiah Jermain's Land then by the same land North West 54 Pches. to another black oak Then by a line of mark'd trees North East 183 Perches to a third black oak Then South East 204 Pches to a post Then by David Cadwallader's Land ^{S. West} 161 Perches to a post Then North West by Vacant Land 150 Perches to a Gum trees Then South West twenty two Pches to the place of Beginning.

Returned into the Secretary's Office July the 30th 1718
