



The above Tract is an Interference of a Tract of 261 acres and
 all^{ce} granted by Patent from T. & R. Penn to Thomas Armor dated 3^d
 July 1772 who sold to Jacob Keagy whose heirs now own and possess the
 same. - A suit of Ejectment was, I understand, brought against Abraham Keagy
 the Elder by the Claimants under Owings, and after the death of the Owings'
 Abraham Keagy the elder came into possession of the improvement and has
 ever since held possession of the Land & removed the Impt. or building -
 Now in Conowago Town^{sh}. Witness my hand
 August 12th 1837
