By vertue of five warrants from y^e Proprietarys and Govern^r Bearing date ye 28th of ye 4th m^o 1683 Directed to me. I hereby Certifie into his Secretarys office that I have Caused to be Surveyed and Laid out ye 8th of ye ninth month 1684 unto Thomas Barker, Sabian Cole, Humphry South, John More, and Sam^l Jobson (Each Purchas- of one Thousand acres of Land) To Each Four hundred acres in ye County of Chest^r being part of their Purchasses, Begining at a Corn^r marked white oat Standing by Chest^r Creek from thence west South West by a line of marked trees Seven hundred and Eighteen perches to a Corn^r post of Richard Collets Land from thence South South East by ye Said Land Four hundred and Eighty perches to a Corn^r marked white oak. thence East North East by a line of trees Six hundred Sixty five perches to a Corn^r white oak. thence north north west by a line of trees Eighty perches to ye afore mentioned Chest^r Creek - thence following up ye Severall Courses there of to the first ~~men~~ Mentioned place of begining. Containing Two Thousand acres. And is accordingly Entred and Recorded in my office at Philadelphia ye 26th of ye 2^d m^o 1687.
