& Lott as above s<sup>d</sup> he seating the Land & fenceing & building upon  
ye Lott w<sup>th</sup> in One year after ye Date of Survey, and make returns  
there of into my Secretary's Office. Given at Philadelphia ye  
4<sup>th</sup> of ye 6<sup>th</sup> mo. 1684.*
