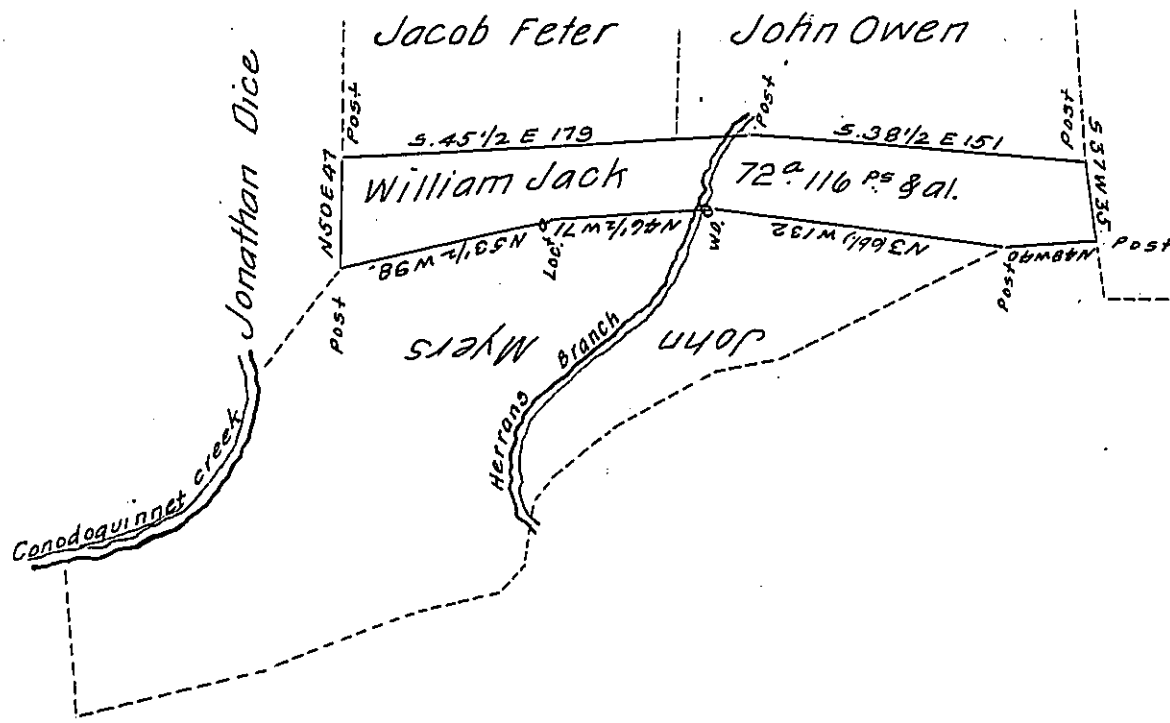


Tho's Ors heirs on

Draught of a Tract of Land situated in Southampton Township Franklin County  
 (formerly Hopewell Township Lancaster County). Containing Seventy two  
 Acres. one hundred & sixteen perches & allowance of six per Cent for Roads  
 &c. Surveyed 15<sup>th</sup> September 1829. In pursuance of a contract with the Board  
 of Property for carrying into effect the Several Acts of Assembly relat-  
 ing to unpatented Lands under Proprietary Rights &c. And by virtue of  
 a Warrant dated 29<sup>th</sup> March 1746. Granted to William Jack for "50 Acres"  
 joining or near Robert Long in Hopewell Township.


Report.

The above Survey is found to be within the lines of 277<sup>3/4</sup> Acres made in pur-  
 suance of a Warrant to John Cessna dated 16<sup>th</sup> December 1755 - the dotted  
 lines represent the balance of Survey on Cessna's Warr<sup>t</sup>. Note. The Warrant of  
 W<sup>m</sup> Jack being stated on the Draft of Cessna's Survey in the handwriting of  
 Mat<sup>w</sup> Henderson formerly D.S. raises a presumption that said Cessna had  
 become the owner of Jack's Warrant.
