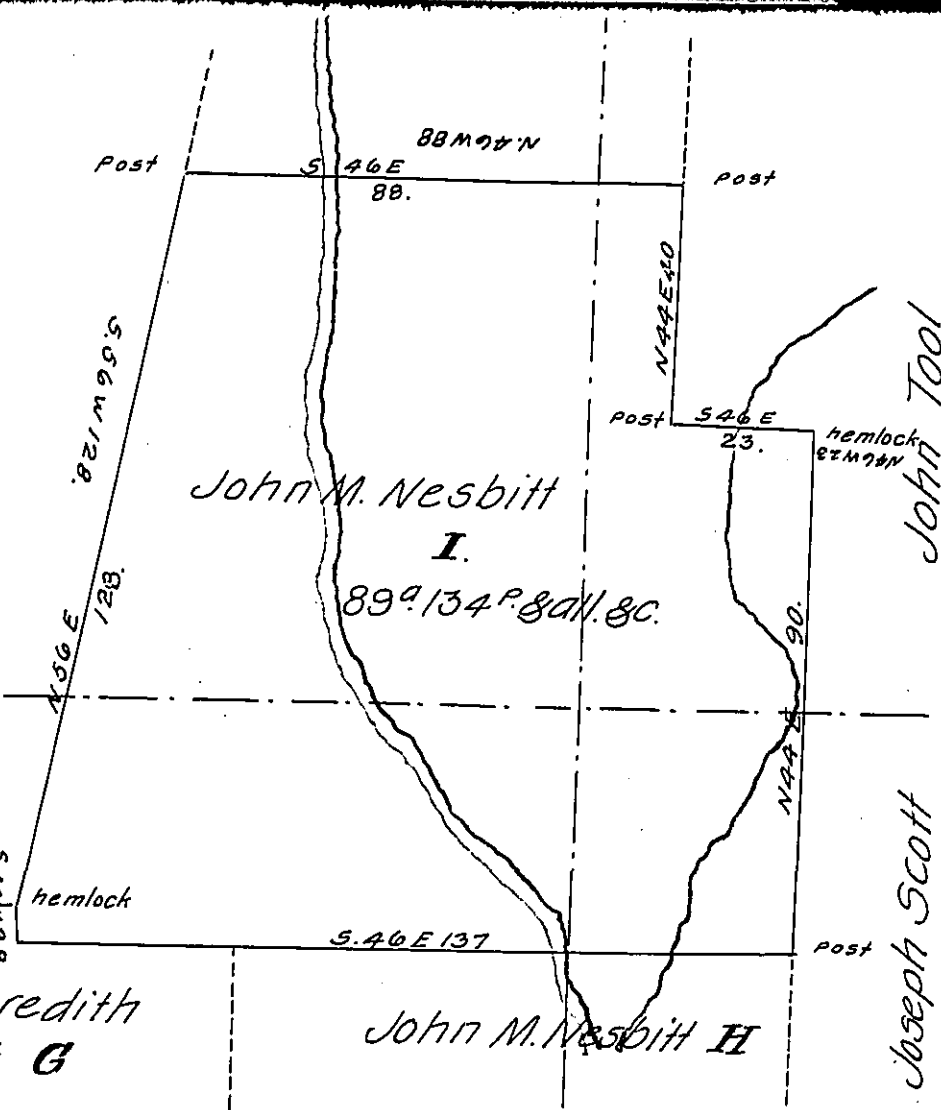

 acres & one hundred & thirty four perches besides the usual allowance &c.
 Surveyed as appears by blocking the trees upon the ground in 1792. and resur-
 veyed the above described tract of land for John M. Nesbitt the 10th day of
 July 1828. By virtue of his warrant dated the 28th day of Dec^r 1774. marked
 I. In pursuance of the authority derived from the Board of Property under the
 act of General Assembly of the 22^d of March 1820. entitled "An act directing
 the recovery of principle and interest due the Commonwealth from per-
 sons holding lands by virtue of locations and other Office titles. issued
 under the Proprietary Government and for other purposes. and the
 Supplement thereto passed the 11th day of April 1825.
