Originally surveyed in persuance of a Warrant granted to Hugh Whiteford for 25^{as} dated the 28th day of December 1744 and now this 14th day of June 1831 the same is examined & Returned by virtue of the Contract entered into with the Board of Property.

Report. The part where the Letter A. is placed containing 68^{as} 80 perches is included in a Survey of 128^{as} 144 perches made and returned in persuance of a warrant granted to said Hugh Whiteford for 130^{as} dated 21st August 1749.

Letter B. containing 26^{as} 80 perches is within the State of Maryland. And the Dotted lines represent the residue of Whitefords last Survey. It is now owned & occupied by John Livingston & Isaac Coalson, Esq. Said to be patented to Hugh Whiteford about the Year 1809.
