Surveyed the 29<sup>th</sup> day of August 1832. by virtue of an Order of Survey granted to John Carmalt dated the 3<sup>d</sup> day of April 1769. N<sup>o</sup> 2778. Containing two hundred & sixteen Acres with the Usual Allowance of Six R<sup>o</sup> C<sup>t</sup> & c.

Note. The same tract of land was surveyed the -day of -1769 for John Potter in pursuance of his Order dated the 3<sup>d</sup> day of April 1769. N<sup>o</sup> 501. And now owned by Doc. Ard of Lewistown Mifflin County in right of the said John Potter.
