Containing one hundred and eighteen acres and allowance of six per cent for roads &c. Surveyed for John Burd the 6th day of June 1786 on order 2139 dated the 12th day of December 1766

No. 1 represented by dotted & Black lines is a draft of a tract of land surveyed on two warrants one in the name of George Burd the other in the name of Elisabeth Walker & John Burd both dated the 18th day of January 1793 this tract interferes one hundred and nine acres and one hundred and five perches with the John Burd survey. John Burd devised his tract to Elisabeth Walker who conveyed to Benjamin Burd who obtained the aforesaid warrants in the names of George Burd & Elisabeth Walker and John Burd and then conveyed to Stephen Keepers whose son John Keepers and widow's husband John Davis Esqr are the present owners No. 2 represented by a dotted line is part of a Draft of a tract of land surveyed for John Davis on warrant dated the 17th day of March 1818 this tract interferes one acre and one hundred and fifty five perches with the John Burd survey, John Davis is the present owner Geo. Burd Patd, E. Walker & Jno. Burd Patd, J. Davis not patd
