



The survey of Alexander McCausland above was made the 4<sup>th</sup> of May 1770 By order of the 3<sup>d</sup> of April 1769 N<sup>o</sup> 2215. The survey of John Latta I have not got, but it is held under a Location of the 3<sup>d</sup> April 1769 No—The dotted lines in the above diagram ~~represent a survey~~ including the letters A.B.C. & D. represent a survey made to Jonathan Paul the 10<sup>th</sup> of May 1828 a return whereof is herewith enclosed. It will be seen that the land called for by Jonathan Pauls warrant had been previously surveyed and appropriated. Benjamin Walker and James Armstrong are in the occupancy of the land and claim under the titles to John Latta and Alex<sup>r</sup> McCausland.
