Surveyed the 18th June 1829, under contract with the Board of Property for ascertaining, surveying & returning unpatented lands under proprietary rights &c &c. By virtue of an order of survey dated 9th of January 1769, No. 5313, granted to Andrew Marshall for 100 acres "joining his other land and heirs of John Thorn dec'd in Hamilton Township"
