The part marked C containing 67^{ac.} 65^{per.} & all. is part of a survey of 68^{ac.} 108^{per.} & all which was surveyed in pursuance of a warrant granted to Samuel McCullough for 60^{ac.} dated the 9th January 1793. the part of McCulloughs survey not taken into this survey interferes with James Roddys improvement.
