willing, to let y^e road from Marcus hooks to Concord run through y^e said
Thousand acres of land, where by understanding made it maybe judged to
be most convenient to travel, & fitt for horse & cart or wagon carriage. These
are obl. will and require thee forthwth to survey or cause to be surveyed into y^r
y^e s^d number of acres in y^e place above mentio^rd, where not already taken up, accord-
ing to the method of townships appointed by me, and make returns thereof into my
secretarys office. Given at Philadelphia y^e 29th of y^e 1st mo. 1683.
