These are therefore in y<sup>e</sup> Proprietarys name to will and require thee forthwith to survey or cause to be surveyd unto him y<sup>e</sup> said number of acres in y<sup>e</sup> afore-said County where not already taken up according to y<sup>e</sup> method of townships apoynted by y<sup>e</sup> Govern<sup>r</sup> he seating and improveing the same according to regulation and make returne hereof to y<sup>e</sup> Secretarys office. Dated at Philadelphia the eight- of y<sup>e</sup> sixth month 1685.
