



By virtue of a warrant from the Proprietor's Comm^{rs} dated the 5th of y^e 9^{br} 1714. I survey'd to John Grafton a certain tract of land ^{situate north} of Nottingham in the County of Chester.

Beginning at a post in the line of Rich^d Harrold thence south east by vacant land two hundred & forty perches to a post. Thence north east by y^e land of William Beal two hundred & ten perches to a Chestnut tree thence north sixty degrees westerly by vacant land two hundred & forty nine perches to a white oak thence south west by y^e land of the s^d Richard Harrold one hundred & forty six perches to y^e place of Beginning. Containing two hundred and fifty acres with the allowance of six p^{cs} Cent.

Survey'd & lay'd out by the Surveyor Generall's order the 19th day of April 1716
