 the tract laid out to Thomas Hayward & Co. where one Tho. Beach lately ~~formed~~
 make a small settlement for which the said Widow hath agreed to pay to y^e Proprie-
 tors use after y^e rate of twelve pounds for each hundred acres besides the usual
 Quittr^t of one shilling Sterling yearly. These are to authorize thee to survey or cause
 to be survey'd to the said Sarah Green the said quantity of two hundred and twenty
 five acres of land situate as afores^d and make returns thereof into the Secretaries
 Office. Which survey in case y^e s^d Sarah shall comply with the agreem^t afores^d
~~th~~ upon or before y^e 29th day of September next shall be valid otherwise the
 same shall be utterly void as if it had never been made nor the warr^t ever granted
 Given under our hands and the seal of the Province at Philad^a the 24th day of the 4th
 month A. D. 1713.
