At the request of John Gregory That we would grant him two hundred acres of land left vacant in the township of Edgemont in the County of Chester, for which he hath agreed to pay to the Proprietors use eighteen pounds & hundred according as the said vacancy shall hold out in twelve months after the date hereof. These are to authorize thee to survey or cause to be surveyed to the said John Gregory the said tract of vacant land ~~and return~~ by the true Bounds of the adjacent lands bounding thereon, and return the same into the Secretaries Office which survey shall in case ye said John comply with the agreement afores^d be valid otherwise shall be void as if the same had never been made nor this warrant ever granted. Given under our hands and the seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 8th day of the 8th moth A. D. 1713.
