



By ye Commiss<sup>rs</sup> Impowred to grant Lotts and lands in ye province of Pennsilvania and Territorys thereunto belonging.

At ye request of John Harding purchaser of five hundred acres that wee would grant him leave to take up one hundred forty and two acres of land it being the remairid<sup>r</sup> of his five hundred acres in the County of Chester.

No. 4 These are therefore in ye Proprietarys name to will and require thee forthwith to survey or cause to be surveyd onto him ye said number of acres in ye aforesaid County where not allready taken upp according to ye method of townships appointed by ye Govern<sup>r</sup>. he seating and improving the same with six months after the date of survey and make returne hereof onto ye Secretarys office given at Philadelphia ye 6<sup>th</sup> day 4<sup>mo</sup>. 1683.
