Surveyed for John Harding one hundred acres of land lying on the east side of Marcus creek beginning at a marked post standing near the 5<sup>d</sup> creek and from thence running E. N. E 80 perch to a marked post from thence running along by John Johnsons line of marked trees N 8 degrees east 92 perch to a marked red oak and from thence running N. N W 5 degrees westerly to a marked red oak being a marked corner tree of the above said Johnsons land and from thence running N S W 130 perch to a marked maple standing by Marcus creek on several courses to the first mentioned post.
