



Pensilvania ss. By the Commissioners of Property

Upon an agreement this day made with Robert Hodgson and James Hendricks both of the County of Chester for ffifteen hundred acres of land on Cone-stogas Creek for which they agree to pay to the propriet^{rs} use one hundred & ffifty pounds for the whole and the usual yearly quitrent of one shilling Sterling for every hundred acres. These are to authorize & require thee to survey or cause to be surveyd unto the said Robert Hodgson & James Hendricks in the Place aforesaid (including within the same those Indian ffields on the northside of the said creek) the quantity of ffifteen hundred acres of land^{in one tract} that has not been already surveyd nor appropriated nor is seated by the Indians and make a returne thereof into ye Secretarys office which survey in case the said Robert and James fulfill the above agreement within thres months after location shall be valid otherwise the same is to be void as if it had never been made nor this warrant ever granted. Given under our hands & seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 16th of the 12th month
