



Pennsylvania ss.

By the Commissioners of Property.

At the request of Henry Hayes lately arrived in this Province That we would grant him to take up five hundred acres of land being one moiety of a thousand acres originally purchased of the Proprietor by Richard Harris: These are to authorize & require thee to survey to the said Henry Hayes the said quantity of five hundred acres of land in the County of Chester where not already surveyed nor taken up nor is concealed nor seated by the Indians, and make returns into the General Surveyors office at Philadelphia where this warrant is to remain and a copy thereof to be delivered to thee certified by the Secretary. Given under our hands and seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 3^d day of September 1705.
