These are to require thee forthwith to resurvey to the said Thomas Howel the said one hundred acres of land located as aforesaid, and make returns thereof into the General Surveyor's office at Philadelphia where this warrant is to remain and a copy thereof to be delivered to thee certified by the Secretary who is also to take a duplicate of the said return into his office. Given under our hands and the seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 18th of the 12th moth 1701.
