At the request of John Hope That we would grant him to take up two hundred acres of land part of a large tract formerly taken up by James Starfield on new rent but by him & his Executors quitted and deserted Situate on the west side of Brandywine Creek and heading the land already granted to Peter Dix: These are to require thee to survey and lay out to the sd John Hope the said quantity of land out of the said tract ~~in~~ in one regular piece without culling or choosing, and make returns thereof into the General Surveyors office at Philad^{ia} where this warrant is to remain, and a copy thereof to be deliv^d to thee Certified by the Secretary: Which survey in case the sd John Hope shall pay or cause to be p^d to ye Prop^{rs} use in this Province the sum of thirty pounds within four months after the date hereof with lawfull Interest for 3 months, & one Bushel of wheat annually for each hundred acres as a quitrent for ever after, shall be valid otherwise shall be void & of no effect as if the same had never been made nor this warrant ever granted: Given under ~~our~~^{our} hands and seal of ye Province at Philad^{ia} 24th 9^{br} 1702.
