By the Commissioners of Property

At the request of William Heddings of the County of Chester that we would grant him to take up among the late surveys made back in the said County the quantity of two hundred acres of land for which he agrees to pay to the Proprietor's use within three months after the date hereof Twenty pounds more of Pennsylvania for the whole and the yearly quitrent of one Shilling Sterling for each hundred acres These are to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be surveyed unto the said William Heddings in the place aforesaid according to the method of townships appointed the said quantity of two hundred acres of land that has not been already surveyed nor appropriated nor is seated by the Indians and make returns thereof into the Secretary's office which survey in case the said William fulfill the above agreement shall be valid otherwise the same is to be void as if it had never been made nor this warrant ever granted Given under our hands and seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 25 day of the 1<sup>st</sup> month Anno Domini 1718.
