At the Request of Hans Graff. That we would grant him to take up two hundred acres of land near the Settlement on Pacquean for which he agrees to pay or secure to the Proprietors use within three months twenty Pounds Money of this Province for s^d said two hundred acres and the usual Quilt^r of one shilling Sterling P^und^s forever after These are to authorize & require thee to survey or cause to be surveyed to the said Hans Graff according to the method of Townships the said two hundred acres of vacant land not yet survey'd nor appropriated nor seated by the Indians and make a return thereof into the Secretaries Office Which survey in case the said Hans fulfill the s^d agreem^t shall be vailid otherwise to be void and of no other effect that as if it had never been made nor this warrant ever granted.
