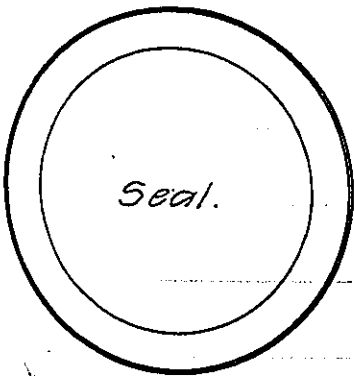

At the request of James Hendricks of the County of Chester That we would grant him to take up one thousand acres of land near Strasburg in the sd County for which he agrees to pay to the Prop<sup>rs</sup> use one hund<sup>d</sup> Pounds for the whole and the usual yearly quitrent of one shilling Sterl. for every hund<sup>d</sup> acres.

These are to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be survey-unto the sd James Hendricks according to the method of townships appointed the sd quantity of one thousand acres of land that has not been already surveyed nor appropriated nor is seated by the Indians and make a return thereof into the Secretarys office which survey in case the sd James fulfill the above agreement within three months after Location shall be valid otherwise the same is to be void as if it had never been made nor this warrant ever granted. Given under our hands and seal of the Province at Philad<sup>ia</sup> the 5<sup>th</sup> 11 mo. A.D. 1714/5.
