



Pennsylvania ss.

By the Commissioners of Property

At the request of John Holland ————— That we would grant him to take up one hundred acres of vacant land between the valley and Goshen in the Welch tract on that part called the Barrons, for which he agrees to pay to the Proprietors use fifteen Pounds money of this Province upon the return of the survey and the usual yearly quitrent of one shilling Sterling. These are to authorize and require thee to survey or caused to be survey'd to the sd John Holland the said quantity of one hundred acres or so much more as he shall think fitt to take in the place aforesaid, (he paying proportionably for the same according to ye aforesaid rate) of land that has not been already survey'd nor is seated by the Indians, And make returns thereof into the Secretaries office which survey in case the sd John fulfill the agreement aforesaid shall be valid, otherwise the same shall be void as if it had never been made nor this warrant ever granted. Given under our hands and the seal of the Province at Philadelphia the thirteenth day of the Eleventh month Jan^y A. D. 1719⁵.
