At the request of Stephen Stapler and John Sotcher Attorneys in behalf of Hannah Hammond of sd Parcvass near Chichest^r in Engl^d That we would grant them to take up two hundred & fifty acres of land in this Province, One moiety thereof in part of W^m Smiths of Bromehouse his original purchase of 1250 acres, w^{ch} part being 125 acres he sold to Benja: Shell and the other now purchased by the sd Attorneys of us for ye use of ye sd Hannah: These are to authorize and require thee to survey and lay out according to the method of townships appointed to ye use of the sd Hannah Hammond the said number of two hundred and fifty acres of land in this Province that has not been already survey'd nor taken up, nor is concealed nor seated by the Indians, and make returns into the Gen^l Surveyors office at Philad^{ia} where this warrt is to remain and a copy thereof to be delv'd to thee certified by ye Secretary Given under our hands and the seal of the Province at Philad^{ia} 14th 7^{br} 1703.
